Taking the living room from rustic to refined was an easy task for Nashville-based designer Eric Ross. All it took was a generous helping-yards and yards-of Thibaut fabric, which he ingeniously draped over a knotty pine wall, adding instant polish. "Since the entire first floor is one giant space, the fabric acts as an unobtrusive room divider," he says. With the generous helpings of textiles in place, Ross layered in a mix of antiques (ironstone and case goods), upholstered furniture (slipper and bobbin-style chairs) and a large skirted table in the middle of the space, which he calls the room's "grand exclamation point." Says Ross, "I love a skirted table-and this one, with its bullion fringe, was the perfect high-low piece for mountain living."
